SPEAKING IN TONGUES

A. WHAT WAS "TONGUE SPEAKING?"

- 1. Speaking a language other than that native to him, or learned in the usual manner.
- 2. Without an interpreter, did not edify the church at all; *and was to be avoided*. (14:18).
- 3. Speaker understood because he "edifeth himself" (14:4).
- 4. Speaks to himself, and to God. (14:27,28).
- B. COULD BE INTERPRETED, in fact MUST BE or be silent.
 - 1. Illustrations:
 - a. Harp or pipe (vs. 7-9).
 - 1). What was their value if could not be understood?
 - 2). Similarly, when words are uttered, unless understood are futile.
 - b. TRUMPET:...Army.
 - 1). If trumpet give an uncertain voice..who shall prepare himself war?
 - 2). Do we: Charge; or Retreat: or Fight; or...Confusion.....

PURPOSE OF TONGUES

A. SPREAD THE MESSAGE OF SALVATION.

- 1. "By men of strange tongues, and by lips of strangers will I speak to this people;" (They could understand because "strangers" spoke their language
- 2. This hastened the spread of salvation.
- B. CONVINCE THE UNBELIEVER.
 - 1. Tongues are sign to the unbeliever (v. 22)
 - 2. God miraculously crossed language barriers with the Gospel.
- C. Until that which was to come. With N.T. in written form this need ended.

Why Need An Interpreter?

A. AT LEAST TWO REASONS:

- 1. If he interpreted for himself then tongue wasn't necessary and was just for show.
- 2. As an additional safeguard Interpreters did so by a gift from God...Insuring the validity of the message.
- B. Otherwise a false prophet teacher could speak in a "tongue" then give the meaning and no one could prove otherwise.

Not A God Of Confusion!

- A. The Confusion of The Situation Paul Described.
 - 1. Several people talking at once.
 - a. No one could understand.
 - b. No one edified.
 - 2. One or more speaking in unknown language.
 - a. Just to impress the hearer.
 - b. No one understood or was edified.
- B. REGARDLESS OF THE GIFT Tongue; Prophecy; Healing; etc......

If used in wrong way, the benefit was lost.

- 1. They lost sight of the purpose of the gift.
- 2. Used with boastful purpose; self glory.
- C. WHAT THE UNBELIEVER THOUGHT!
 - 1. He had been invited, and has come...
 - 2. All he sees or hears is chaos or confusion. '
 - 3. His impression of Christianity leaves much to be desired.
 - 4. He returns to his idol.
- D. A LESSON FOR THE WORLD TODAY! (And for the church)
 - 1. A pagan, invited to come and hear Christianity today.
 - 2. Hears a hundred different things, and a very uncertain sound.
 - 3. More often than not...turns from the confusion and goes back to his religious world.
