INTRODUCTION

- A. "And who is he that will harm you, if ye be zealous of that which is good? But even if ye should suffer for righteousness' sake, blessed are ye: and fear not their fear, neither be troubled; but sanctify in your hearts Christ as Lord; being ready always to give answer to every man that asketh you a reason concerning the hope that is in you, yet with meekness and fear;" v 13-15.
 - 1. Don't give conflicting answers.
 - 2. Say one thing Do something else.
- B. OUR ANSWER MUST BE:
 - 1. Clear.
 - 2. Firm.
 - 3. Sure.
 - 4. Definitive
 - 5. Believable. (Not like a double minded man".
- C. In I Peter 3, let us note some things that will "Strengthen Our Lip".

BELIEVABILITY

- **A.** THE BELIEVABILITY OF OUR MESSAGE IS STRENGTHENED BY CONSISTENT ACTION BASED ON INFORMED CONVICTION.
 - 1. See TEXT:
 - 2. The Christian who knows what he believes and why, who stands by his convictions without compromise will be respected even by those who are not yet ready to believe.
 - 3. True, he may at times suffer but at least he is suffering for doing good rather for doing evil.
 - 4. In the final count, "who is he who will harm you if you become followers of what is good?" v. 13.
- B. Many who have persecuted or criticized Christians have eventually believed.
 - 1. They accepted the message when they saw that it meant enough to Christians to die for it.
 - 2. Cf. Saul of Tarsus.

BY GODLY EXAMPLE

A. OUR EFFORTS TO TEACH Are Strengthened By Godly Example. v. 1,2.

- 1. Likewise you wives, be submissive to your own husbands, that even if some do not obey the word, they, without a word, may be won by the conduct of their wives, when they observe you chaste conduct accompanied by fear."
- 2. Two people who love God and each other should be able to agree."
- B. The principle of this lesson applies in all relationships.
 - 1. Christians should be the best workers, students, executives, etc.
 - 2. In every plant, school or office.

BY INNER CHARACTER

A. OUTWARD NATURAL BEAUTY IS STRENGTHENED BY INNER CHARACTER.

- 1. "Whose adorning let it not be the outward adorning.....let it be the hidden man of the heart, in the incorruptible apparel of a meek and quiet spirit, which is in the sight of God of great price." v. 3-5.
- 2. "For in this manner, in former times, the holy women who trusted in God also adorned themselves..." e.g. Sarah.
- B. Male/female roles were set in nature by God.
 - 1. He does not expect both to compete for the same roles; they complement each other. It is no insult to each to be fully what God created each to be.
 - 2. Women are especially pivotal in God's plans for the human family.

BY ACTIONS

- A. Human Relationships Are Strengthened <u>By Actions</u> that are accompanied by <u>Sincere Conviction and Compassion.</u>
 - 1. "Be of one mind, having compassion for one another..." v.8.
 - 2. "Love as brothers" v. 8c. Christians are a family.
 - 3. *"Be tenderhearted..."* v. 8d. Kindness and compassion are a cardinal trait
 - 4. *"Be courteous"* v 8e. Human relationship are weakened by rudeness. Why is this command less important than Peter's command in Acts 2:38?

- B. Not Rendering Evil For Evil or Reviling for Reviling, but ...bless. v.9.
 - 1. "Refrain his tongue from evil..speak no guile. v. 10, Col. 4:6. James 3.
 - 2. "Turn away from evil and do good..seek peace" v. 11.
 - 3. PRAY. As a righteous person, not as one who does evil. v. 12.

CONCLUSION

A. ONE'S CONSCIENCE TOWARD GOD IS STRENGTHENED BY FULL, **CAREFUL OBEDIENCE TO GOD!**

- 1. "Which also after a true likeness doth now save you, even baptism, not the putting away of the filth of the flesh, but the interrogation of a good conscience toward God, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ." v 21.
- 2. Peter has just referred to the eight souls who were saved through water when Noah built the ark.
- B. Just as the water was a point of transition to bring them from the old world of filth into a new world.
 - 1. God uses Baptism in a manner that corresponds to it.
 - 2. It is not a physical bath, that removes dirt from the body.
 - 3. It has a spiritual consequence in that we make our appeal to God for a clear conscience by obeying this form of the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus.
 - 4. Cf. Rom. 6:3-6; 16-18; Acts 2:38; Acts 22:16.
