 - 2. This standard had to be maintained.
- C. <u>Would it not be just as reasonable to expect the kind of life that every</u> <u>Christian should live?</u>
 - 1. Is there not a standard to be met?

 - 1. The life must show it.
 - 2. They are widows indeed, not because they claim it But because they live it!

 - 1. IS IT POSSIBLE?
 - 2. How? By the life they live!

BECOME A CHRISTIAN

- A. FIRST ONE MUST BECOME A CHRISTIAN.
 - 1. Not enough just to claim to be a Christian.
 - 2. What is the standard not from man, but from God.
 - 3. How do we know when one becomes a Christian.
- B. TO BECOME A CHRISTIAN ONE MUST:
 - 1. <u>Hear</u> about it. No one ever became a Christian without hearing the message of Christ. (Rom. 10:17).
 - 2. If one does not <u>Believe</u> what he hears, he can't accept it.
 - a. When he hears and believes it, he changes his life.
 - b. If his life is not changed, he does not believe.
 - 3. One become a Christian when he turns from sin (<u>Repent</u>) and his attitude toward the world is changed. (Luke 13:3)
 - 4. He acknowledges to the world his faith in Christ (<u>Confession</u>). He confesses for all the world to hear.
 - 5. He dies to the world, is buried with Christ, and with his sins forgiven he is raised to walk in a new life. <u>Baptism.</u> (Rom. 6).
