INTRODUCTION

A. TEXT: "For yourselves know how ye ought to imitate us; for we behaved not ourselves disorderly among you; neither did we eat bread for nought at any man's hand, but in labor and travail, working night and day, that we might not burden any of you: not because we have not the right, but to make ourselves an ensample unto you, that ye should imitate us." (v. 7-9).

B. BY DEFINITION:

- 1. Webster: "a pattern; a model or copy; an illustration.
- 2. In New Testament word comes from; "in writing; an under writing; to write under, to trace letters for copying. Hence a writing copy, an example."
- C. EASY TO MOVE THIS FIGURE OVER TO HUMAN BEHAVIOR.
 - 1. From birth, much of what we learn, we learn from example.
 - 2. As parents, teachers, leaders, how many times do we say, "let me show you how" or "just do like I do."
 - 3. As this helps to mold us physically and socially, we must recognize the effect that example has on us Spiritually.

 - 3. Established the system of worship that God directed. (Took a while).
 - B. Bad.
 - 1. "Now these things were our examples, to the intent we should not lust after evil things, as they also lusted. <u>Neither</u> be ye idolaters, as were some of them; as it is written, 'The people say down to eat and drink, and rose up to play.' <u>Neither</u> let us commit fornication, as some of them committed, and fell in one day three and twenty thousand.

<u>Neither</u> let us make trial of the Lord, as some of them made trial, and perished by the serpents. <u>Neither</u> murmur ye, as some of them murmured, and perished by the destroyer. Now these things happened unto them by way of example; and they were written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the ages are come." (I Cor. 10:6-11).

- c. An example of WHAT NOT TO DO!!

PAUL AS AN EXAMPLE

A. HOW HE BECAME AN EXAMPLE.

- 1. Did not set out with desire to be an example.
- 2. But recognized that his position (apostle, teacher) made him an example.
- 3. Recognizing this he made himself an example of following Christ.
- B. "BE YE IMITATORS OF ME, EVEN AS I ALSO AM OF CHRIST." (I Cor. 11:1).
 - 1. "Brethren, be ye imitators together of me, and mark them that so walk even as ye have us for an ensample." (Phil. 3:17).
 - 2. "The things which ye both learned and received and heard and saw in me, these things do: and the God of peace shall be with you." (Phil. 4:9).

CHRIST OUR EXAMPLE

A. OBEDIENCE:

- 1. "Have this mind in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: who existing in the form of God, counted not the being on an equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being made in the likeness of men; and being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, becoming obedient even unto death, yea, the death of the cross." (Phil. 2:5-8).
- 2. As we follow the example of Jesus in obedience, we obey God even unto death.

B. ENDURANCE. Steadfastness.

- 1. Unto the end.
- 2. In the garden. "Not my will, but thine be done."

C. FORGIVENESS.

- 1. "Forbearing one another and forgiving each other, if any man have a complaint against any; even as the Lord forgave you, so also do ye:" (Col. 3:13).
- 2. No one has ever treated us worse than they treated Him yet He offered them forgiveness. "Father forgive them…they know not what they do." (Luke 23:34).

D. SUFFER.

- 1. "For hereunto were ye called: because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, that ye should follow his steps:" (I Pet. 2:21).
- 2. Suffering lead to being exalted to the right hand of God on His Throne.

E. LOVE.

- 1. "A new commandment I give unto you, that ye love one another; even as I have loved you, that ye also love one another." (John 13:34).
- 2. How much did Jesus love....
