INTRODUCTION

(Phil. 4:10-20)

<u>TEXT:</u> "And the Lord said unto Paul in the night by a vision, Be not afraid, but speak and hold not thy peace: for I am with thee,...." (Acts 18:9-10)

- A. THE SETTING: Paul As he entered Corinth.
 - 1. He was <u>alone</u>, Silas had been left at one congregation...Timothy had been sent to Thessalonica.
 - 2. He was <u>broke</u>, needed money and a job. (We sometimes forget the humanity of the apostles).
 - 3. Physically exhausted, walk of 50 miles from Athens to Corinth.
 - 4. Spirit beaten down (I Cor. 2;1-3 Paul's arrival at Corinth).
- B. It was about this period that Paul wrote the words of our text.
 - 1. "For I have learned, in whatever state I am, therein to be content."
 - 2. "I can do all things in him that strengtheneth me"
- C. Let's look at what happened in Corinth to see how God <u>supplied</u> all things needed for Paul.

AQUILA AND PRISCILLA

- A. HOW DID PAUL MEET THEM?
 - 1. Put an add in the paper?
 - 2. Went to the church building?
- B. They had been expelled from Rome by Claudius because they were Jews.
 - 1. Had to flee Rome....this was bad
 - 2. But look what a blessing it turned out for both them and Paul.
- C. Paul "abode with them, and they wrought; (worked) for by their trade they were tentmakers" v. 3.
 - 1. Paul is no longer alone.
 - 2. No longer broke
 - 3. God Has Supplied!

Silas And Timothy Return

- A. Silas had remained with the young church at Berea and Timothy had been sent to Thessalonica.
 - 1. Had returned with good news.
 - 2. Timothy reported on the church at Thessalonica (see First and Second Thessalonians) and evidently brought financial relief from Macedonia (Acts 18;1-3).
- B. Paul therefore "devoted himself to the word"
 - 1. At this point we begin to see the growth of the church in Corinth.
 - 2. But with growth came problems.
 - 3. Let's see how God again Supplies.

GOD SHALL SUPPLY

Judgment Seat of Gallio

- A. The unbelieving Jews bring charges against Paul.
 - 1. This is a scene that has been repeated many times.
 - 2. Paul thought he knew what to expect. (Philippi, Thessalonica, etc.)
- B. Begins to make his defenseinterrupted by Gallio
 - 1. "If it were a matter of crime...I would hear"
 - 2. "But a question of names and you law...I refuse to hear"
 - 3. Again God Supplied!

BE NOT AFRAID

- A. "And the Lord said unto Paul in the night by a vision, Be not afraid, but speak and hold not thy peace: for I am with thee, and no man shall set on thee to harm thee: for I have much people in this city. And he dwelt there a year and six months, teaching the word of God among them." (v. 9-11).
 - 1. "I am with you"
 - 2. Again God Supplied.
- B. "I have much people in this city"
 - 1. Foreknowledge ...but not predestination.
 - 2. Paul continued in Corinth for a year and a half.

APOLLOS

- A. WHO WAS HE? v. 24-26.
 - 1. An eloquent or learned man.
 - 2. Mighty in the Scriptures.
 - 3. He had been instructed in the way of the Lord.
 - 4. He was fervent
 - 5. He taught accurately the things of Jesus.
 - 6. He was bold.
- B. WHAT HE LACKED v. 25b.
 - 1. He lacked knowledge of the Great Commission.
 - 2. He lacked forgiveness of sins.
 - 3. He lacked the true baptism of Jesus. Mark. 16;15,16.
- C. WHAT HE DID vs 26b-28.
 - 1. He did not get angry
 - 2. He listened to further instruction.
 - 3. He was baptized for the right purpose
 - 4. He then preached the whole truth
 - 5. He was sent a letter of recommendation from the group in Ephesus to the church in Corinth.

- 6. He helped the church in Achaia.
- D. Note: I Cor. 1;12ff; 16:`12; 3:6; 16:12; Tim. 3:13.
- E. Paul planted...Apollos watered... God gave the increase. AGAIN GOD SUPPLIED!

- B. Vs. 19 "And my God shall supply every need of yours according to his riches in glory in Christ Jesus."
