VISIONS OF JUDGMENT

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INTRODUCTION

(Matt. 25:31-46)

A. TEXT: Acts 24:25.

B. SETTING:

- 1. Paul's arrest and the trip to Caesarea.
- 2. His Roman citizenship had saved him.
- 3. Now has been brought before the governor, Felix.

C. WHO WAS FELIX?

- 1. Was born a slave in the home of Agrippina, mother of Claudius.
- 2. Had risen from position of slave to that of ruler.
- 3. Was steeped in the blood of private murder and public massacre.
- 4. Had been ruling there for 8 years.
- 5. <u>Drusilla</u>, was the daughter of Herod Agrippa, who had murdered the apostle James. (Acts 12).
 - a. Had been given in marriage to Aziz, king of Emesa.
 - b. Had abandoned him and was living with Felix.

D. HIS VISION OF JUDGMENT.

- 1. Considered his life.
- 2. "And was Terrified.

JUDGMENT WILL BE....

A. SEPARATION (Matt. 25:32)

- 1. Sheep on right hand...... RIGHTEOUS
- 2. Goats on left WICKED
- B. REWARD:
- C. ETERNAL (Matt. 25:46).
 - 1. Eternal life.
 - 2. Eternal death

JUDGMENT DETERMINED BY

- A. DEEDS DONE IN THE BODY; How we lived (II Cor. 5;10).
 - 1. Whether it be good..
 - 2. Or whether it be bad
 - 3. How we have lived.
- B. OBEDIENCE \ DISOBEDIENCE (II Thess. 2).
 - 1. Vengeance to them that <u>obey not</u> the gospel.
 - 2. Know not God.
 - 3. "Believed not the truth, but had pleasure in unrighteousness"
 - 4. "Eternal destruction from the face of the Lord."

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- C. WISE AND FOOLISH BUILDERS (Matt. 7)
 - 1. "Do these words of mine....
 - 2. "Doeth them not...
- D. PREPARATION:
 - 1. Five wise... were ready when the bridegroom came.
 - 2. Five foolish...had not made proper preparation!

MANY DESIRE TO...

- A. REASONED WITH FELIX OF...
 - 1. Righteousness.
 - a. Rightness, right conduct, purity of life.
 - b. Right relationship with God.
 - 2. SELF CONTROL...TEMPERANCE.
 - a. To hold ones self within due limits.
 - b. Control or master the passions and desires of the body.
- B. Felix was Terrified, yet as many do.....
 - 1. He attempted to put off his responsibility....
 - 2. WAIT FOR A MORE CONVENIENT SEASON.

THE CONVENIENT SEASON

- A. Opportune, or seasonable time, right time. ..Conducive to ease or comfort.
- B. IS SELFISH. My convenience above your convenience. (Mat. 13:44;)
- C. DOES NOT RESPECT AUTHORITY.
 - 1. After two years, Felix was called to Rome to give account.
 - Imagine Felix telling Nero, "Wait until I am good and ready".
 Tell IRS, "When it's convenient, I'll send you something."

 - 4. As much sense as to put off the King of kings and the Lord of lords.
- D. DOES NOT MEET RESPONSIBILITY.
 - 1. Maturity demands that we meet the responsibilities of life.
 - a. Stewards (I Cor. 4:1,2; I Pet. 4:10; Titus 1:7)
 - b. To your family, citizen, job, etc. Eph. 6:4.
 - c. Responsibility of rightness (Acts 17;30).
 - d. Responsibility to God (Acts 17:30; 2 Pet. 3:9)
 - 2. Responsibility for our soul (I Pet. 1:22,23).

VISIONS OF JUDGMENT

DO YOU JUDGE FELIX?

- A. Have you reasoned about righteousness.
 - 1. Are you right with God?
 - 2. "Is Thy Heart Right With God"
- B. Have you taken charge of your life by a surrender to God?
 - 1. Repentance is that change of mind and purpose that results in change of life.
 - 2. How do you view the coming of the Lord in Judgment? (Mk. 9:44ff; Rev. 11:14; Rom. 2:16; Eccl. 12:12,13).
- C. ARE YOU PUTTING THE LORD OFF FOR A CONVENIENT SEASON?
 - 1. About your study? (2 Tim. 2;15).
 - 2. About your work for the Lord (John 9:4).
 - 3. Faithfulness (Heb. 10:22-26).
 - 4. Obedience to the Gospel (Heb. 5:8,9).
- D. FOR SO MANY, THE "CONVENIENT SEASON" NEVER COMES.
 - 1. It is folly and dangerous to wait for a more convenient time.
 - 2. We recognize that in the care for the physical body.
 - 3. Obedience must be out of **CONVICTION** rather than convenience.
