WHY DID THE EARLY CHURCH GROW

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INTRODUCTION

- A. TEXT: "Now in those days, when the number of the disciples was multiplying,...And the word of God increased; and the number of the disciples multiplied in Jerusalem exceedingly;" (Acts 6:1; 7.
- B. SETTING: The growth and spread of the church just before the death of Stephen.
- C. One thing that all religious bodies have in common, is "They want to grow".
 - 1. This is one of the reasons for the changes that we see in what the world calls the church.
 - 2. The feeling is that <u>all kinds of changes</u> must be made to accommodate modern man.
 - 3. All kinds of ideas, things, practices, etc. have been introduced in an effort to attract more people.
- D. THE NEW TESTAMENT CHURCH GREW....NOT ONLY GREW BUT IT MULTIPLIED.
 - 1. HOW?
 - 2. What caused the New Testament Church to grow?
 - 3. If we do what they did, we will also grow. Let's see what they did!

STEADFASTNESS

- A. "And they continued steadfastly..." (Acts 2:42)
 - 1. The expression denotes the idea of endurance and perseverance.
 - 2. A hindrance today is the "on again, off again" status of many members.
- B. A great need in the church today is steadfastness.

FAITHFULNESS

- A. "And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine...."
 - 1. Not only were they steadfast, but it is important *how* they were steadfast.
 - 2. They were <u>faithful</u> in doctrine.
- B. Paul admonished Timothy: "take heed unto thyself, and unto the doctrine; continue in them: for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee" (I Tim. 4:16).
 - 1. The early church <u>valued the truth.</u>
 - 2. Their emphasis on "the apostles doctrine" did not keep them from growing.
 - 3. They maintained their convictions, yet they grew.
- C. IT IS UNFORTUNATE THAT SOME TODAY FEEL THAT IF WE PREACH THE TRUTH, WE WILL DRIVE PEOPLE AWAY.

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UNITY

- A. "And the multitude of them that believed were of one heart and of one soul..." (Acts 4:32).
 - 1. There was a common purpose that held the disciples together.
 - 2. Could there be a higher compliment paid to a church today?
- B. In to many places today we find division and fragmentation.
 - 1. All too often the problem is caused by works of the flesh: jealousy, envy, anger, and pride.
 - 2. We must learn to "be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment" (I Cor. 1;10).

C. ISN'T IT STRANGE:

- 1. That UNITY was one of the principles that caused the early church to grow....
- 2. The religious world today thanks God for the divisions that we have.
- 3. JESUS TAUGHT: "that they may all be one; even as thou, Father, art in me, and I in thee, that they also may be in us: that the world may believe that thou didst send me." (John 17:21).

BENEVOLENCE

- A. "Neither said any of them that ought of the things which he possessed was his own" (Acts 4:32).
- B. Further they did good "unto all men" as they had opportunity (Gal. 6:10; II Corinthians 9:13).

DISCIPLINE

- A. Ananias and his wife, Sapphira.
 - 1. The story.
 - 2. "Great fear came upon all the church, and upon as may as heard these things.
- B. Might think all would be afraid of the church thereafter.
 - 1. But the text records that "believers were the more added to the Lord" (Acts 5:14).
 - 2. We sometimes forget that God's plan works.
- C. DISCIPLINE is correction, and instruction and if necessary withdrawing of fellowship. It is necessary for at least five (5) reasons: (1) to demonstrate to the world that the church does not tolerate sin; (2) to warn those within against sin. (3) to keep the church pure; (4) to restore the erring; (5) to be obedient to scriptural teaching.

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DAILY EMPHASIS

- A. "And they, continuing daily with one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, did eat their meat with gladness and singleness of heart" (Acts 2:46).
- B. The early disciples carried their faith with them on a day-to-day basis.
 - 1. The tendency today is to be "Sunday-oriented" or "building-oriented."
 - 2. That is we confine our religious emphasis to assemblies on the Lord's day or to occasions when we meet at the church building.
 - 3. "And daily in the temple, and in every house, they ceased not to teach *Jesus as the Christ.*" (Acts 5:42)

COMMITMENT

- A. After the apostles had been taken before the council and ordered not to speak in the name of Jesus, they were beaten and released.
 - 1. We are told "they departed from the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer shame for his name" (Acts 5;41).
 - 2. "If any man suffer as a Christian, let him not be ashamed; but let him glorify God on this behalf" (I Pet. 4;16).
- B. After the death of Stephen...
 - 1. "They therefore that were scattered abroad, went about preaching the word. (Acts 8:4).
 - 2. Commitment....not Compromise!
