GODLY FEAR "OUR GOD IS A CONSUMING FIRE"

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INTRODUCTION

- A. READ BEFORE LESSON: (Exodus 19:16-20; then Exodus 20:18-21).
- B. The writer continues his exhortations.
- C. We are encouraged by all of these witnesses (Chapter 11).
- D. Look to Jesus the author and perfecter of our faith.
- E. Consider what Christ suffered. Our example:
 - 1. For the joy set before him....
 - a. Joy was not in shame, suffering and death...
 - b. But in what it would bring on the other side.
 - 2. Let us, as did Christ, look beyond the immediate sufferingTo the blessings that will come.

APPLICATION

- A. A CALL TO SERVE GOD ACCEPTABLY:
- B. THIS EXHORTATION IS BASED:
 - 1. First, on the supreme example and complete sufficiency of Jesus Himself as the author (pioneer) and perfecter of our faith (vv 1-3).
 - 2. Second, on the positive purpose and profit of trials under the providence of a loving heavenly Father (vv 4-11).
 - 3. Thirdly, on the dangers of the greater (and even fatal) failure to which the slack and careless expose themselves (vv 12-17).
 - 4. Fourthly, on the amazing privileges of grace to be enjoyed under the new covenant (vv 18-24).
 - 5. Finally, on the impending and inescapable consummation of God's dealing with men (vv 25-29).

CONTRASTS

- A. That which was experienced by those under the Old Covenant (Ex. 20)
 - 1. Those things were earthly, visible, terrifying and forbidding.
 - 2. They stood in the presence of a tangible mountain and actual burning fire.
 - 3. The place was overshadowed by clouds and intense darkness and the violence of storm.
 - 4. The whole experience was so terrifying that the people asked that it might cease (Ex. 20;18).
- B. HOW DIFFERENT is the experience of drawing nigh to God in which we as Christians are called to share.
 - 1. These are heavenly, unseen, all glorious and all gracious.
 - 2. We come to the true mountain and city of God, where God actually dwells; to hosts of angels in festal array (v. 22).

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- 3. To the church of the privileged with heavenly inheritance.
- 4. To the all sovereign God as their Vindicator.
- 5. And to Jesus as Mediator!

GODLY FEAR

- A. Review opening remarks about Exodus 20. Also vv 18-24.
- B. READ...MALACHI chapter One.
 - 1. Offer polluted bread upon the altar.
 - 2. "Ye offer the blind for sacrifice.
 - 3. "That which was taken by violence, the lame and the sick"
 - 4. "And sacrifice unto the Lord a blemished thing (1:14).
- C. GOD'S RESPONSE:
 - 1. "Present it now unto thy governor, will be pleased"
 - 2. "I have no pleasure in you"
- D. I AM GREAT KING SAYETH JEHOVAH OF HOSTS, AND MY NAME IS TERRIBLE AMONG THE GENTILES"

"WHERE IS MY FEAR?" v. 6

- E. Malachi describes a people who had lost their fear and respect for God And their actions showed their lack of respect and reverence for Him.
- F. All we need to do is ask....<u>what happened to them?</u>

GODLY FEAR

- A. An obvious lacking on the part of man today is for fear and respect for God.
 - 1. Just as with Israel their life showed their lack of regard for God..
 - 2. Even so today....
- B. It is not to suggest that we should be terrified of God...
- C. BECAUSE GOD IS LOVE.
- D. BUT WHEN Israel lost their fear and reverence for God they were destroyed.
- E. We need to remember that not only is our God a <u>God of Love -</u> He is also <u>A CONSUMING FIRE</u>" (Hebrews 12:29).
