# **SPIRITUAL IMMATURITY**

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### **INTRODUCTION**

Heb. 5:11-14

- 1. The importance of the subject already treated.
- 2. The importance of the Message and the Messenger (Chapters 1 and 2).
- 3. The power of God's Word (Chapter 3 and 4).
- 4. Christ our High Priest (First part of chapter 5).
- 5. The absolute essential nature of all of this because it determines our relationship with God!
- 6. The danger now expressed in last half of chapter <u>five</u> was that they had become so immature that they did not grasp the lesson and thus were in danger of losing their relationship with God.
- 7. Let us Notice:

### **Cause for the Exhortation**

#### A. THE WRITERS SUBJECT:

- 1. Which only the mature could fully understand.
- 2. How Christ is our High Priest, (Last weeks lesson).
- 3. Their difficulty in understanding was a lack of keeping the basics.
- B. AWARENESS OF THEIR BACKWARD PROGRESSION:
  - 1. Instead of growing in "grace and knowledge" ...
  - 2. They were actually gong backwards.
  - 3. They were forgetting the first things they had learned.
- C. RECOGNITION OF GOD'S PURPOSE FOR HIS CHILDREN.
  - 1. "And having been made perfect, he became unto all them that <u>obey</u> him the author of eternal salvation." v. 9.
  - 2. Obedience is essential.
  - 3. But ... How can one obey if he doesn't understand?
  - 4. This inability to understand, is not because of the difficulty of the message...But because of the dullness of the hearer!
- D. ULTIMATE ALTERNATIVE:
  - 1. Complete relapse and terrifying judgment. (10:27)
  - 2. What is; and is the Cause of "Dull Hearing"?

## **DULL OF HEARING**

- A. A CONDITION INTO WHICH THEY HAD GRADUALLY LAPSED.
  - 1. They had not always been like this.
  - 2. Formerly they had had eager mind, but over the years had become "dull"
- B. DULLNESS OF HEARING is a metaphor for <u>mental sluggishness and</u> <u>spiritual apathy.</u>
  - 1. "But I have this against thee, that thou didst leave thy first love" (R. 2:4)
  - 2. "I know thy works, that thou art neither cold nor hot. So because thou art lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spew thee out of my mouth" (Rev. 3:15-16)

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- A. "YOU NEED MILK, NOT SOLID FOOD."
  - 1. THE PARALLELS OF THE CHILD AND MILK, AND THE MATURE Christian and solid food were generally known (I cor. 2:6; 3:2; 14:29; Eph. 4:13-14; I Pet. 2:1-2).
  - 2. They were going in the wrong direction.....Back to infancy.
- B. "WITHOUT EXPERIENCE" v. 13.
  - 1. A person might be physically mature; but if he knows nothing of the word, he would be called a "babe".
  - 2. \*\*Babies do not have the ability to discriminate.
    - a. They cannot choose for themselves.
    - b. Must take whatever is set before them.
  - 3. An adult does not need someone to stand over him always reminding him of what foods are good and bad.
  - 4. So the **adult Christian** is able to distinguish good from evil.

## **OUGHT TO BE TEACHERS**

- A. WHAT IS MEANT BY "TEACHER"?
  - 1. Some times we get the idea of classroom or...
  - 2. Class type situation.
- B. TO BE A TEACHER meant to the ancient mind that one was able to think and to act maturely.
  - 1. That was something these Christians could not do.
  - 2. They still needed a teacher.
  - 3. Needed to go back to the very ABC of God's Word.

## A. TRAINED BY PRACTICE:

- 1. In any endeavor in life the adage is: "use it or lose it."
- 2. Things we may have once learned well...if we do not use it we will lose the ability to function. (Typing; math; cooking; etc.)
- B. YOU DON'T GET THERE WITHOUT PUTTING FORTH THE EFFORT!
  - 1. "Give diligence to present thyself approved unto God.." (II Tim. 2;15).
  - 2. "I press on toward the goal unto the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 3:14).
  - 3. "Be ye steadfast, unmovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord" (I Cor. 15:58).
- C. "For I am already being offered, and the time of my departure is come. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the course, I have kept the faith: henceforth there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give to me at that day; and not to me only, but also to all them that have loved his appearing. (II Timothy 4:6-8)
