FRANK BRISCOE JOHN Chapter Eleven

I AM THE RESURRECTION

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INTRODUCTION

A. TEXT: "Martha saith unto him, I know that he shall rise again in the resurrection at the last day. Jesus said unto her, I am the resurrection, and the life; he that believeth on me, though he die, yet shall he live; and whosoever liveth and believeth on me shall never die." (vs. 25-26)

B. SETTING:

- 1. Jesus had returned to Bethany.
- 2. Lazarus had died.
- 3. Mary and Martha met Jesus and said; "Lord if thou hadst been here, my brother had not died." v. 21.

JESUS' RESPONSE

- A. "Thy brother shall rise again." v. 23.
 - 1. They did not doubt this.
 - 2. But thought only of "the resurrection at the last day".
- B. "I AM THE RESURRECTION AND THE LIFE".
 - 1. THOUGH HE DIE; YET SHALL HE LIVE.
 - 2. HE THAT BELIEVETH ON ME SHALL NEVER DIE.
- C. WHAT DID JESUS MEAN BY THESE STATEMENTS?
 - 1. What was their understanding.
 - 2. "Yea, Lord; I have believed that thou art the Christ, the Son of God, even he that cometh into the world." v. 27.
 - 3. Not a full understanding...but they began to see...

THEIR RESPONSE

- A. LIMITED to their understanding of their religion.
 - 1. "Thy brother shall rise....Their answer...."I know he shall rise again in the Resurrection at the last day."
 - 2. They had thus far ascribed to Jesus personally <u>no supernatural power.</u>
- B. THEIR THOUGHT!
 - 1. These powers (resurrection) were only in God.
 - 2. But bestowed by a request from Jesus.
 - 3. "Whatsoever thou shall ask of God, God will give thee."
 - 4. <u>It was to this attitude, this understanding that Jesus identifies himself as THE RESURRECTION!</u>.

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C. "I, AND NO OTHER, AM THE RESURRECTION AND THE LIFE."

- 1. He was the <u>origin</u>, the design and the power of both!
- 2. In no way were they obtainable except by Him. "Except ye believe that I am He, ye shall die in your sins." (John 8:24).

JESUS' EXPLANATION

- A. FIRST: Though he die, yet shall he live...."
 - 1. Signifies physical death.
 - 2. Thus, the assurance that physical death is not the end.
 - 3. Review and recap I Cor. 15.
 - 4. The same word in the final clause of the first sentence is used in a spiritual sense to indicate that such a one will be spared the <u>second</u> death.

B. THE MEANING:

- 1. Whosoever believe in me even though he shall did (physically) shall live (spiritually) for ever.
- 2. And he who now lives and believe on me shall for ever avoid spiritual death."

THEOLOGY

A. THE ABSOLUTE PROMINENCE GIVEN IT IN NEW TESTAMENT.

- 1. <u>Evidential:</u> The Resurrection is the proof of the atoning character of the death of Christ, and His Deity and Divine exaltation.
- 2. <u>Evangelistic:</u> The primitive gospel included testimony of the Resurrection. (I Cor. 15).
- 3. <u>Spiritual:</u> Every aspect of the Christian life from the beginning to the end is some how associated there with. (Rom. 6).
- 4. <u>Eschatological:</u> the Resurrection is the guaranty and model of the believer's Resurrection. (I Cor. 15).
- 5. So our bodies are to be quickened (Rom. 8:11), and made like Christ's glorified body (Phil. 3:21).
- B. HAD CHRIST NOT BEEN THE RESURRECTION AND THE LIFE....Then Christianity would have no:
 - 1. Have no meaning.
 - 2. Have no Hope!

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CONCLUSION

A. IF CHRIST IS NOT THE RESURRECTION....Then Four Things:

- 1. Your Faith is vain.(I Cor. 15:14).
 - a. Man would lose confidence in God.
 - b. Trust in His Word would be destroyed.
- 2. "You are yet in your sins" (I Cor. 15:17).
 - a. Christ was raised for our justification (Rom. 4:25).
 - b. If no Forgiveness....<u>No Peace; no Freedom; No Happiness; NO HEAVEN!</u>
- 3. All which are fallen asleep in Christ are perished. (I Cor. 15:18).
- 4. THERE WOULD BE NO!::
 - a. "Let not your heart be troubled: believe in God, believe also in me. In my Father's house are many mansions; if it were no so I would have told you; for I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I come again, and will receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also." (John. 14:1-3).
 - b. ""for I know him whom I have believed, and I am persuaded that he is able to guard that which I have committed unto him against that day." (I Tim. 1;12).
 - c. "....henceforth there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give to me at that day; and not to me only, but also to all them that have loved his appearing." (II Tim. 4:8).
- B. "WHEREFORE, MY BELOVED BRETHREN, BE YE STEADFAST, UNMOVABLE, ALWAYS ABOUNDING IN THE WORK OF THE Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labor is not vain in the lord." (I Cor. 15:58).
