- A. TEXT: "Jesus therefore, knowing all the things that were coming upon him, went forth and saith unto them, Whom seek ye? They answered him, Jesus of Nazareth. Jesus saith unto them, I am he." (John 18:4-5).
- B. SETTING:

1.THE SOLDIERS AND OFFICERS, LEAD BY Judas have arrived to arrest Jesus.

- 2. Their shock when He did not try to hid or escape.
- 3. They expected either "fight or flight."
- C. It is Interesting To Follow The Questions Asked In This Chapter.
 - 1. From them we learn much about those who ask.
 - 2.We learn more about Jesus.
 - 3. And applying some of these questions to our self, we can learn about us.

FOR THE MOB

A. "WHOM SEEK YE?"

- 1. Logical question. It was evident from their appearance they were seeking someone.
- 2. We are seeking "Jesus of Nazareth."
 - a. Was this contemptuous?
 - b. Not Jesus. Not Jesus of Jerusalem or Galilee.
- 3. Jesus' immediate response.... "I AM HE".
 - a. Make no mistake. Do not think it is one of the disciples.
 - b. His answer, and immediate confession took them by surprise.
- B. SO MUCH SO THAT HE ASKED AGAIN... Whom seek ye?
 - 1. They were expecting Him to deny or to hide.
 - 2. They had brought Judas, to personally identify Him.
- C. TODAY: A lot of people are surprised when they meet Jesus.
 - 1. Not what they were looking for.
 - 2. It was not what they expected.
 - 3. Jesus does not hid from man today. If we want to find Him we can!

BY HIGH PRIEST

- A. TWO PART QUESTION. v. 19.
 - 1. "Who Are Your Disciples?"
 - 2. "What Do You Teach?"

B. NOT SINCERE QUESTION BECAUSE:

- **1.** They had been watching Jesus for 3 years.
- 2. They knew His followers were of the people.
- 3. It was not a secret fellowship.
- C. THEY HAD HEARD HIM TEACH.
 - 1. Were familiar with His lessons.
 - 2. They did not accept or agree...But they knew what He taught.
 - 3. As seen earlier They were jealous.

QUESTION BY PILATE

A. HIS QUESTIONS FOR THE JEWS.

- 1. "What accusation bring ye against this man". v. 29.
- 2. They had brought Jesus to Pilate before the day had dawned.
- 3. At this early hour, Pilate must have thought it to be a serious charge.
- B. HE MUST HAVE BEEN AMAZED AT THEIR ANSWER.
 - 1. What he might have expected...murder; treason; some high crime!
 - 2. Instead all they could say was; "*If this man were not an evil doer, we should not have delivered him up to thee.*" v. 30.
 - 3. At this, Pilate sought to dismiss the case.
 - 4. Only to find out they were seeking the death penalty. v. 32.

<u>Pilate Questions Jesus</u>

A. ART THOU THE KING OF THE JEWS? " v. 33.

- 1. It would appear that the governor was more amused then disturbed by this accusation.
- 2. "THOU" is emphatic position in the Greek.
- 3. "Thou"...One so humbled, the King of the Jews?...
- 4. Obviously he did not see the threat the Jews wanted him to see.

QUESTIONS

- B. "WHAT HAS THOU DONE?" v 35.
 - 1. He did not like the answer Jesus had given. V. 34.
 - 2. There seems to be scorn in this reply.
 - 3. Pilate understood it had to do with Jewish law, which he did not understand.
- C. "ART THOU A KING THEN?" v. 37.
 - 1. Jesus had spoke of His kingdom. v. 36.
 - 2. To Pilate there seemed to be nothing to pose a threat to Rome.
- D. "WHAT IS TRUTH?" v. 38.
 - 1. Some see this as an earnest longing of a sincere heart.
 - 2. Others view it as worldly skepticism.
 - 3. Perhaps Pilate was simply weary of futher discussion.

4. How good it would be if it were a truly sincere Question!

OUR LAST QUESTION

- A. This Very Important Question is <u>Asked Three Times.</u>
 - 1. Man's eternal destiny depends on the answer to this question.
 - 2. We will see it as applied to Peter, Then consider it as applied to us!
- **B. THE QUESTION:**
 - 1. *"Art thou one of his disciples*?" v. 17.
 - 2. Same question in v. 27.
 - 3. Then a kinsman of him whose ear Peter had cut off... "*Did not I see thee in the garden with him?*" v. 26.
 - a. Was Peter scared?
 - b. Did he think of the consequence, if he was known to have been with Jesus?

C. WE KNOW PETER'S ANSWER.

- 1. No
- 2. NO!
- "Then began he to curse and to swear, I know not the man." (Matt. 26:74). How emphatic his 3rd "no" was.

D. THE LAST QUESTION OF OUR LESSON!

- 1. Are YOU one of "this man's disciples?"
- 2. What is **YOUR** answer?
- 3. Remember A disciple is a follower....where ever Jesus leads!
