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INTRODUCTION

A. <u>**TEXT:**</u> "And he found in the temple those that sold oxen and sheep and doves, and the changers of money sitting: and he made a scourge of cords, and cast all out of the temple, both the sheep and the oxen and overthrew their tables; and to them that sold the doves he said, Take these things hence; make not my Father's house a house of merchandise." (vs. 24-16).

B. THE SETTING:

- 1. Jesus had come to Jerusalem at the beginning of His public ministry.
- 2. What He found in the Temple was an indication of what He would find among the Jews.
- C. THE BUILDING OF THE TEMPLE. (I Kings 6).
 - 1. It is hard to imagine the glory and beauty of the Temple.
 - 2. Everything in it was over laid with pure gold.
 - 3. No way we could evaluate even the physical value of the Temple.
 - 4. Can you imagine how it must have felt just to enter such a place?
- D. THE PRAYER OF DEDICATION (I Kings 8).
 - 1. "But will God in very deed dwell on the earth? Behold, heaven and the heaven of heavens cannot contain thee; how much less this house that I have builded! Yet have thou respect unto the prayer of thy servant and to his supplication, O Jehovah my God, to hearken unto the cry and to the prayer which thy servant prayeth before thee this day; that thine eyes may be open toward this house night and day, even toward the place whereof thou hast said, My name shall be there; to hearken unto the prayer which thy servant shall pray toward this place." vs. 27-29.
 - 2. Picture the temple then,-what it must have looked like when Jesus came.

CLEANSED TWICE

- A. TWO OCCASIONS WHEN JESUS CLEANSED THE TEMPLE.
 - 1. At the beginning of His ministry. (John 2).
 - 2. At the end of His ministry. (Matt. 21:12ff; Mark 11:15; Luke 19:44-45).
- B. ANY SIGNIFICANCE TO THIS... at Beginning and End of His ministry?
 - 1. Possible for emphasis.
 - 2. To show the need for respect for God.
 - 3. Knew what was to come...How Has God's House Been Treated Over The Years.
 - 4. Does the church, God's temple today need to be cleansed?

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<u>WHY</u>

- A. Why would man "dirty" or "abuse" God's Temple? Several possible reasons
 - 1. GREED: Man sees in religion a way to prosper. Take advantage of needs and feelings of others. (This is what the Jews were doing).
 - A. Some have started their own religion.
 - B. Others heap upon themselves titles and honors.
 - 2. LACK OF RESPECT FOR GOD...LACK OF FEAR!
 - a. "Make my Father's house a house of merchandise"
 - b. Serve the god of this world.
 - 3. IGNORANCE.
 - a. Acts 17. No excuse.
 - b. Do not recognize that which soils God's House. (Sin is no longer called sin).
 - 4. SELF PLEASING.
 - a. Place what "I want" above what God says.
 - b. Whether it is financial or personal power the end is the same.
- B. DO NOT CONSIDER OR RECOGNIZE IT AS GOD'S TEMPLE.
 - 1. It had become "their temple", not God's Temple.
 - 2. Lack of respect for authority!
 - a. Did not accept God's Word.
 - b. Made Their Own Rules....Laws....Creeds.

THE CHURCH

A. "Know ye not that ye are a temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you? if any man destroyeth the temple of God, him shall God destroy; for the temple of God is holy, and such are ye." (I Cor. 3:16,17).

- 1. Called both the Temple and Kingdom of God.
- 2. Use of the terms draws from Old Testament.
- 3. The church today.
 - a. So many man made, man named and man organized.
 - b. Treat it as if were their own.
- B. We Considered A Moment Ago The Beauty And The Cost Of The Temple Built By Solomon.
 - 1. Jesus promised to build His (Matt. 16:18) Planned from beginning.
 - 2. The Cost. The Blood of Christ (Acts 20:28).

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- C. Can You Imagine Man Defiling God's Temple Today?
 - 1. We noted earlier how man defiled God's Temple then.
 - 2. The reasons. Are about the same today.
 - a. Greed.
 - b. Ignorance
 - c. Lack of respect and fear of God.
 - d. Self pleasing.
- D. Man Does Not Consider The Church as God's...<u>BUT AS THEIR OWN!</u>
 - 1. To build it, control it, use it as they please.
 - 2. It has become Man Serving INSTEAD OF God Pleasing!

OUR BODY

- A. "Or know ye not that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit which is in you, which ye have from God/ and ye are not your own; for ye were bought with a price; glorify God therefore in your body." (I Cor. 6:19,20).
 - 1. A sense in which our body is the temple of God.
 - a. Church is the Temple of God.
 - b. We as individuals make up the church.
 - 2. Keep your body pure.
- B. WHAT DEFILES MAN...WHAT MUST BE CLEANSED?
 - 1. SIN. (Rom. 3:23, all sin; Rom. 6:23, wages of sin is death).
 - 2. Sin, and those who practice sin cannot enter or inherit the kingdom of God. (I Cor. 6:9; Gal. 5:21).
- C. JESUS CLEANSED THE TEMPLE.
 - 1. How does He clean it (us) today?
 - a. Acts 2:38; 22:16. "Wash away thy sins"
 - b. Rev. 1:5, "washed us from our sins"
 - c. Rev. 7:14, ".....they washed their robes, and made them white in the blood of the Lamb."
 - d. READ...<u>I Cor. 6:9-11.</u>
 - 2. Keep it clean. I John 1:9.
