#### **INTRODUCTION**

- A. TEXT: "Only let your manner of life (behave as citizens worthily) be worthy of the gospel of Christ: that, whether I come and see you or be absent, I may hear of your state, that ye stand fast in one spirit, with one soul striving for the faith of the gospel; (1:27) "For our citizenship is in heaven;" (3:20).
- B. PAUL'S FIRST VISIT TO PHILIPPI.
  - 1. On his  $2^{nd}$  journey.
  - 2. "Come over in Macadonia, and help us." (Acts 16:9).
  - 3. Conversion of Lydia and the jailer (no one remembered longer, yet we don't know his name, only his occupation."
- C. From The Philippian Letter We Have The Picture Of A Strong, Christ Centered Church.
  - 1. Had helped spread the gospel from the beginning.
  - 2. Much encouragement and help given to Paul.
- D. This Letter Is Paul's Encouragement To Them To Live As Citizens Of The Kingdom.
  - 1. They were, as was Paul:
    - A. Servants v. 1; bond-servant or slaves, they belonged to Christ.
    - B. Saints sanctified, set apart in Christ Jesus.
  - 2. Therefore they were to:
    - A. Stand fast v. 27
    - B. In one spirit, with one soul striving for the faith of the gospel." v. 27.
- E. They were to "Behave" or live as good Citizens... The other reading of v. 27.

#### GOOD CITIZEN

### A. WHAT MAKES A GOOD CITIZEN?

- 1. <u>Obedience</u>.
  - a. Respects and observes the laws of the land.
  - b. Accepts his responsibilities.
- 2. <u>Loyalty.</u>
  - a. Faithful at all time, not just when things are going his way.
  - b. Supports its actions.
  - c. Doesn't render aid to the enemy.
- 3. Productive.
  - a. A giver...not just a taker.
  - b. Some live their whole life on welfare know how to take every advantage (Not saying 'welfare' is bad, but they that abuse it).

- B. A GOOD CITIZEN IS A POSITIVE NOT A NEGATIVE.
  - 1. Contributor not a liability.
  - 2. We don't really have a problem seeing the difference between a good citizen and a bad citizen.
- C. APPLY THESE SAME POINTS TO CHRISTIAN CITIZENSHIP.

#### **BAD CITIZEN**

#### A. NOT NECESSARILY A CRIMINAL.

- 1. One in jail.
- 2. A fugitive.
- 3. Or guilty of treason, etc.
- B. IT IS ALSO A 'BAD CITIZEN' WHO:
  - 1. Is non productive.
  - 2. Always a taker.
  - 3. Never accepts any responsibility for:
    - a. Upkeep.
    - b. Furtherance
    - c. Serving...leading, etc.

C. SAME PRINCIPLES APPLIED TO THE CHURCH.

#### **OUR CITIZENSHIP**

- A. "For our citizenship is in heaven; whence also we wait for a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ" (Phil. 3:20).
  - 1. Those of the world mind earthly things (3:19).
  - 2. We need to mind spiritual things.
- B. Much of 1<sup>st</sup> Peter is built around the fact that we are just passing through this world and that our Real Home is Heaven.

  - "pass the time of your sojourning in fear" (I Pet. 1:17).
    "Beloved, I beseech you as sojourners and pilgrims, to abstain from fleshly lusts, which war against the soul;" (I Pet. 2;11).

#### **DESIRE THE BENEFITS**

- A. SOME WANT ALL THE BENEFITS OF CITIZENSHIP WITHOUT BEING A CITIZEN.
  - 1. Some want all the benefit that their country has to offer....But they don't want to pay the taxes. Or do their part.
  - 2. They want their country to serve them...but they never serve their country.
- B. DO WE HAVE ANY IN THE CHURCH LIKE THAT TODAY?
  - 1. Want to be 'born in church'; married in the church; buried by the church."
  - 2. Served by the church , but never serving.
  - 3. Is the church the kingdom here to serve us <u>or</u> are we here to serve in the kingdom??

  - 1. We all hold citizenship some where....
  - 2. Are you a Christian, a citizen in God's Kingdom?
