10. Is there any instruction about being *quick and slow*?

James Chapter 2

1. How can you become a judge with evil thoughts?
2. Who is the one who will likely drag you into court?

4. What triumphs over judgment? Under what law?
5. Can a man be saved who has faith but who does not have deeds, action or works – which would prove his faith?
6. What kind of faith is described as a “dead faith?”
7. Can you show your faith without doing something to prove it?
8. If a man is saved by faith without an action to prove his faith, then are demons saved?

 6. What evidence is given to prove that a man or woman is wise?
 7. What is the source of disorder and evil practice?
 8. Can you find eight qualities of the kind of wisdom that comes from heaven?
