### **Something In A Name**

- A. Names in the Old Testament were full of meaning.
  - 1. Noah = Rest
  - 2.  $\overline{Dan} = A Judge$
  - 3.  $\overline{\text{Daniel}} = \text{God is my Judge}$
  - 4.  $\overline{\text{Israel}}$  = The Prince that prevails with God.
- B. The Same true in the New Testament.

## **DISCIPLES** (John 13:35)

- A. Literally has reference to "A learner, A pupil or a student."
- B. As used in the New Testament it signifies one of the Lord's followers. (Matthew 11:28-29; John 3;1-2).

# BELIEVERS (I Pet. 1:21)

- A. This word has great meaning and suggests a close relationship.
- B. It means more than a mere intellectual acceptance of the truth.
- C. The meaning is that of trust. (Heb. 11:6; II Tim. 1:12).

### **BRETHREN** (Acts 11:29)

- A. It involves that of brotherhood. (John 13:34-35).
- B. The New Testament exemplified this relationship (Acts 11:17-30).
- C. The idea of helping others. (Galatians 6:1,2).

# **SAINTS** (Romans 1:7)

- A. Many think of "Saints" in terms of Roman Catholic Church.
- B. The word means; "set apart for God, to be as it were, exclusively His. (<u>John</u> 17:24-26; I Peter 2:9).
- C. Holy living is under consideration. (Phil. 4:21).

## **CHRISTIAN** (Acts 11:26)

- A. Followers of Christ. Belonging to Christ. Anointed.
- B. Isaiah 62:1,2; "A new name which Jehovah shall name."

## **NOTHING IN A NAME**

- A. All man given names mean or signify something.
- B. Look at any of the denominational names around us.

C. The very use of the names were and are for the purpose of setting them apart from others.
