BY DEFINITION

<u>OBEDIENCE</u> = An act or fact of obeying, or state of being obedient. <u>OBEDIENT</u> = Obeying; willing to obey; submissive to restraint, control, or Command. It implies compliance with the demands or requests of one in authority.

"And Samuel said, Hath Jehovah as great delight in burnt-offerings and sacrifices, as in obeying the voice of Jehovah? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to hearken than the fat of rams." (I Samuel 15:22).

- 1. "Though he was a Son, yet learned obedience by the things which he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became unto all them that obey him the author of eternal salvation;" (<u>Heb. 5:3,9).</u>
- 2. "And to you that are afflicted rest with us, at the revelation of the Lord Jesus from heaven with the angels of his power in flaming fire, rendering vengeance to them that know not God, and to them that <u>obey not</u> the gospel of our Lord Jesus:" (II Thess. 1;7,8).
