

# WHY THE MIRACULOUS GIFTS OF TOWGUES IN THE BOOK OF ACTS

TO THE APOSTLES ON PENTECOST.... The tongues in this chapter as exercised by the apostles attracted the sermon of Peter and the apostles as they told that the Jesus whom they had crucified was now exalted to the right hand of God and was shedding forth those things they were seeing and hearing. This confirmed the doctrine of the apostles and distinguished them from the other disciples as the givers of the doctrine of Christ. The whole Church continued steadfastly in the apostles doctrines as they were the recattention of the Jews from every nation that had assembled together for Pentecost. 
