FIRST CORINTHIANS

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<u>CITY OF CORINTH</u>

- 1. An ancient city having been established in about 1350 B.C.
- 2. In 146 B.C. rebelled against Rome and was completely destroyed. Rebuilt in 46 B.C. by Julius caesar.
- 3. Situated on an Isthmus between two seas, it was natural that it developed into a great city. Controlled the sea trade and land trade of Greece.
- 4. A city filled with idols and known throughout the world for its immorality. The temple of Aphrodite, known to Romans as Venus; owned a 1000 harlots who's sandel message "Follow Me". To Corinthianize was to debase - to bring to the lowest moral level.
- 5. Into this city Paul came in A.D. 51 or 52. Alone, broke, and discouraged from what had happened at Athens.
- 6. At this time Corinth was a city of some 600,000 people. Paul stayed there a year and a half. Then in about 57 A.D. from Ephesus wrote this letter to the church in Corinth.

THE BASIC MESSAGE

- A. <u>First</u>, the Christ and His gospel constitute the solution to every problem, and the answer to every question.
- B. <u>Second</u>, the book is designed to encourage brethren to be faithful to God and His will. (1:9) (15:1-2) (15:58)

AN AMAZING PARADOX

- A. Corinth was a wicked, corrupt, licentious city. A city of idolatry.
- B. The church of God is composed of those who are "called out of" and who are "separated from" the world.
- C. What a contrast! The city of Corinth and the church of God.
- D. Broad-mindedness led to toleration of wickedness.
 - 1. It was bad when Lot moved his house into Sodom; It was far worse when Sodom moved into his house.
 - 2. It is good for a boat to be in the water, but bad for water to be in the boat.
 - 3. It was good for the church to be in Corinth, But it was bad for Corinth to be in the church.

CHURCH PROBLEMS

- A. The church has always had problems.
 - 1. On the divine side it is absolute perfection.
 - 2. On the human side there are imperfections.
 - 3. Every problem is on the human side.
- B. SOLUTION: When brethren are determined to think as the Bible teaches To speak and does Bible teaches, they will be What Bible teaches (1:10)

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SOME PROBLEMS

- A. THE PROBLEM OF DIVISION: (1:10 4:21).
 - 1. God desires unity. Christ prayed for unity, and brethren are instructed to "keep the unity of the Spirit."
 - 2. Not unity at any price But unity upon the terms of the Gospel of Christ.
- B. OF FAILURE TO GROW: (3:1-3).
 - 1. When one is baptized into Christ he is a babe, regardless of his age.
 - 2. But we cannot be pleasing to God unless we grow.
 - 3. We grow by study, prayer, by faithful attendance, and by diligent service.
- C. OF TOLERATION OF SIN:
 - 1. They failed to recognize "a little leaven leaveneth the whole lump."
 - 2. Instead of mourning they were "puffed up."
 - 3. Church discipline (withdrawal of fellowship) is definitely demanded by Bible teaching.
- D. IMMORALITY: chapter 5.
- E. OF SINFUL LITIGATION:
 - 1. Brethren over "the smallest matters"...trivial, trifling, petty.
 - 2. Paul instructs that all such action is sin.
 - a. <u>Question</u>: is there a time or place when say for example the elders can resort to the courts?
 - b. How did we get the deed to the property.
 - c. Can we go through the same means to keep it?
 - d. Paul was talking about small, personal, petty matters.
- F. PROBLEMS RELATING TO MARRIAGE:
 - 1. Relationship between husband and wife.
 - 2. If one is an unbeliever
 - 3. Whether to marry or not...or marry again after husband/wife dies.
- G. RELATED TO THE LORD'S SUPPER: Paul stressed:
 - 1. That the Supper is to be observed "in remembrance" of Christ.
 - 2. That it "proclaims the Lord's death till He come.
 - 3. That it has to be partaken of in worthy manner, Personal examination .

H. OF SPIRITUAL GIFTS......OF THE RESURRECTION; GIVING

<u>THE RESURRECTION:</u> Separate lesson on First Corinthians chapter 15. Especially 15:29....Baptism for the dead.

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THE GOSPEL IS POWER

- A. THIS IS A LESSON THAT THE WORLD SO DESPERATELY NEEDS TODAY!!
 - 1. With all of the "it doesn't make any difference what you believe" messages being presented in the world today.
 - 2. We need to recognize that it takes POWER to cleanse us from sin and to Deliver us from the power of Satan.
 - 3. Man does not have that power!
 - 4. Man, left to himself and his own powers is forever lost.
- B. IN ROMANS 1:16, PAUL DECLARES......
 - 1. I Corinthians 6:9-11, ... **READ**
 - 2. Vs. 9,10.
 - 3. V 11, "And such were some of you Note the past tense. What had happened?
 - 4. "But ye were washed, but ye were sanctified, but ye were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, and in the Spirit of our God."
- C. That power which can take a sorry, sinful, low-down human being, and transform him into an upright, honorable citizen of the Kingdom of God is power indeed! Thank God for the POWER OF THE GOSPEL.
