SECOND JOHN

INTRODUCTION

A. BACKGROUND:

- 1. Seems to be the shortest book in the Bible.
- 2. But in the Greek contains a few more words than 3rd John.

B. AUTHOR:

- 1. Were some doubts in the early church as to the authenticity of these brief epistles.
- 2. Most of the external evidence rest on the writings of early church. Clement, Origen and Dionysius. Irenaeus was a disciple of Polycarp who was acquainted with John.

C. DATE:

1. Near the end of the 1st century.

D. PURPOSE:

1. "On The Truth" its place in our life.

- E. WRITTEN TO "THE ELECT LADY AND HER CHILDREN"

 1. Possible Cyria, the Greek word for lady, that appears no where else in N.T.
 - 2. Others contend that "the elect lady" refers to the church.
 - 3. If so, who were her children and who would be "the elect sister" v. 13

DIVINE TRUTH

A. IN ITS RELATION TO BELIEVERS (1:6).

- 1. We are to love "in truth".. Not in the truth.
- 2. But love of each other without pretense.
- 3. How often God speaks in His Word of the love we are to have one for another.!

B. "GRACE, MERCY, AND PEACE SHALL BE WITH US" (v. 3).

- 1. This beautiful salutation, common to New Testament writers.
- 2. It Expresses:
 - a. First, Grace God's favor and good will, the fountain of all good things.
 - b. Mercy is its outpourings.
 - c. And Peace, its joyous effect.

C. "I FOUND CERTAIN OF THY CHILDREN WALKING IN THE TRUTH"

- 1. "Walking" carries the idea of living (See the "walks" of the Ephesians).
- 2. "In the truth" would be according to the truth of God's word. (V. 3).
- 3. The thought is habitual action, progress toward a goal.

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The Test Of The Truth

A. THE NEED:

- 1. "For many deceivers are gone forth into the world, even they that confess not that Jesus Christ cometh in the flesh. This is the deceiver and the anti-christ." (V. 7).
- 2. The denial of Christ.
- B. They denied the fundamental fact of the gospel....the Incarnation.
 - 1. As we note those of the world, John encourages us....
 - 2. "Look to yourselves, that ye lose not the things which we have wrought, but that ye receive a full reward." (v. 8).
 - 3. Constant and careful self-inspection and ceaseless vigilance against enticements to evil are a vital necessity.
- C. "WHOSOEVER GOETH ONWARD AND ABIDETH NOT IN THE TEACHINGS OF Christ, hath not God: he that abideth in the teaching, the same hath both the Father and the Son." (v. 9)
 - 1. Today there is a loose and lax attitude toward the inspiration and authority of the scriptures.
 - 2. To go beyond the limits of the teaching of Christ.
 - 3. Any departure from the truth.

Defense Of The Truth

- A. "If any one cometh unto you, and bringeth not this teaching, receive him not into your house, and give him no greeting: (v. 10)
 - 1. Do not permit Christian hospitality to afford an opportunity for any false teacher to pervert the faith of the brethren.
 - 2. Do not support ..do nothing that would support or encourage teaching that is not true.
- B. "For he that giveth him greeting partaketh in his evil works" (v. 11).
 - 1. Sin should be treated as a contagious disease.
 - 2. We are to avoid even the appearance of evil.
 - 3. READ VERSES 12 AND 13.
