CHRIST A MAN OF PRAYER

I. CHRIST'S EXAMPLE OF PRAYER-

- Christ was a man of unceasing prayer. This was the secret of His spiritual power. If we are to follow Him, we must learn to pray as He did. We cannot be true Christians without this.
- 2. Christ often prayed in secret -
 - a. Matthew 14:23-He went into a mountain apart to pray.
 - b. Mark 1:35- He prayed in solitary places.
 - c. Luke 5:16 He withdrew into the wilderness to pray.
- 3. Many of Christ's greatest experiences were preceded by prayer
 - a. Luke 3:21 -- Jesus prayed at His baptism.
 - b. Luke 6:12 -- The selection of the twelve was preceded by a whole night of prayer.
 - c.Luke 9:18 -- The promise to build the church was preceded by prayer. Mt. 16:13-19.
 - d.Luke 9:28-29-His transfiguration was preceded by prayer.
 - e.Luke ll:1-4--The Model Prayer was given after the disciples heard Jesus pray.
 - f.John 11:41-42-The raising of Lazarus was preceded by prayer.
 - g. John 17:1-26-His gethsemane experience was preceded by prayer.
 - h. Luke 22:39-45-The cross was proceded by prayer.
 - i.Luke 23:34,46-Christ endured the cross with the help of prayer.
- 4. Christ Often Prayed For Others -
 - a. Luke 22:31-32 -- He prayed for Peter to stand firm.
 - b. John 17: 9-19 -- He prayed for the twelve apostles.
 - c. John 17:20-26 --He prayed for all believers in all ages.

LESSON FOUR

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THE MODEL PRAYER

Introduction:

- 1. Upon seeing Jesus pray, the disciples said, "Lord, teach us to pray." Luke 11:1-4. This was the occasion for the prayer.
- 2. Jesus gave this prayer to teach us how to pray. Mt. 6:9-13. It is our model. In it we have the essential elements of prayer.
- 3. This prayer is divided into two parts:

I. PRAYER FOR GOD'S GLORY AND HONOR

- 1. A recognition of God as our Father-a. "Our Father." God must be a Father to us if prayer is to be vital.
 - b. Can an alien pray this prayer? John 8:44
- 2. For the glory of God's name
 - a. "Hallowed by Thy name"
 - b. We must revere God's name and desire that it be exalted.
- 3. For the extension of God's kingdom
 - a. "Thy kingdom come". What did this mean then? What does it mean now? Can Christians pray this now? If not wny not?
 - b. If we pray for God's kingdom what does this obligate us to do?
- 4. For the prevalence of God's will
 - a. "Thy will be done in earth as it is in heaven".
 - b. Can we pray this without endeavouring to bring our will into harmony with God's will?
 - c. If prayer is to be effective, we must desire that God's will, not ours, constantly prevail in our lives.

II. PRAYER FOR OUR DAILY NEEDS

- 1. Petition for material needs
 - a. Give us this day our daily bread."
 - b. What does this include? For what material blessings can we proc. If we pray for daily bread, what does this obligate us to do
 - d. Why work for daily bread(IIThess.3:10) if God gives it?
- 2. Petition for spiritual needs
 - a. Forgiveness for the past. "Forgive us our debts".
 - b. Help foo the present "Lead us not into temptation".
 - c. Deliverance foe the future-"Deliver us from evil".
 - d. If we make these petitions, what are we obligated to do?

- 13. We must pray with submission to God's will-Luke 22:42; Matthew 6:9-10.
