- C. Number of 38 minute classes: thirteen.
- **II. Course Description:** This course is an examination of how to define and sustain a biblical faith; the destiny of the soul of man; and why we are losing members of the church to the world.

VII. Course Procedures:

- A. The course will be formal lectures on video.
- B. Keep a notebook this notebook must be neat and well organized. The notes must be full and understandable so that they will be a valuable tool for years to come.
- C. Tests.
 - 1. There is one written test.
 - 2. When you receive a test you have permission to look at it and study it prior to taking it.
 - 3. However, when you actually take the test you must do so completely from memory.
- D. Term Paper.
 - 1. Write an overview of each of the thirteen chapters in the text book. Devote at least half a page to each chapter. Above each paragraph(s) indicate which chapter you are discussing so that it is obvious when you move from one chapter to the next.
 - 2. The paper should be a minimum of seven pages, typed and double spaced. If handwritten, the paper should be a minimum of ten pages, single spaced.
 - 3. The paper is due when you mail VBI your test.
- E. Grading.
 - 1. The term paper and test will be graded separately.
 - 2. The final grade is based on an average of all assigned work with the written test counting twice.
 - 3. You may request that a grade be explained or reconsidered, but in any case VBI will have the final say.
- F. Summary Of Requirements.
 - 1. View each video lesson in its entirety.
 - 2. Submit a term paper.

- 3. Take one written test.
- 4. Have a combined grade average of at least 70.
- G. Credit.
 - 1. Credit will be issued, including a certificate, only after all work has been successfully completed, tapes have been returned (if rented) and all invoices for this particular course have been paid in full.
