# Name Authority for Nashville, Tennessee Stone-Campbell Congregations

This list comprises 440 variations of time, place and character names for 247 known congregations of the Stone-Campbell Movement in Nashville and Davidson County, Tennessee from 1812 to March 2020. Though the Christian Movement was established in Sumner, Davidson and Tennessee counties in the 1790s, the sources, few and far between in their own right, have not yielded what we have come to expect in a 'name' for a congregation or its meetinghouse for the first twenty years of this history. Apparently these Christians worshipped in homes or shared accommodations with other groups. The earliest we can go back is 1812 to what is now known as South Harpeth Church of Christ. As the movement flourished throughout the nineteenth century, new congregations gathered across the city and county. Some were short-lived while others persisted for generations in the same location. The rest moved, morphed, merged, split, swarmed or otherwise planted still more congregations, and therein hangs a tale.

When I first began focused research on these congregations in 2001 I realized I could not attempt to write such a history of Nashville Churches of Christ unless and until I had a definitive grasp of the lay of the congregational landscape in all of its texture. In time I borrowed the concept of 'intellectual control' from my work in archival science to help me articulate my intent behind this list and to help me define the parameters of my study. In archival work, to gain intellectual control is to know something about the materials at hand. Its corollary is physical control: knowing where an item is located. When archivists know what they have, and where it is stored, they are in a very good position to serve researchers. Applying this concept to the history of Nashville Churches of Christ, I determined to discover how many congregations existed in the city (now county). I reasoned that until I exercised due diligence here, I could not credibly tell their story, much less analyze them. So, I set out to assemble the list and go where it might lead. I quickly discovered even this preliminary task would require much more from me than I initially thought.

In 2006 began with the several directories edited by Mac Lynn, along with the annual *Yearbook of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ)*. While with little effort I readily assembled a list of over 150 congregations, I almost immediately recognized a need for some system by which to account for the name and location changes, mergers and other subtleties the sources revealed. The system of cross-references I utilize here remains essentially unchanged from my first design. I applied it to my list of 150 congregations and kept sifting hundreds of sources for additional entries. Published sources include every extant Nashville city directory and telephone book; newspaper articles, advertisements, notices, announcements and listings of church services; denominational yearbooks and directories; congregational directories and bulletins; local, state and national governmental directories and reports; and articles, notices, and advertisements in over a dozen religious periodicals. Unpublished and archival sources include privately compiled directories and lists, archival finding aids, and registers. I also made phone calls, sent emails, sent numerous appeals in public and private though social media posts and messages, plus many visits to congregations.

Very early in this process I decided not to footnote my sources in this document. I have always regarded this name authority as a discovery tool preliminary to a critical, narrative interpretation of the Stone-Campbell Movement in Nashville. As a discovery tool it defines the congregational

subjects of a historical analysis and is therefore prior to historical analysis. In the early stages of my work I reasoned that footnoting each variant would create an inordinate delay and duplicate effort which I would in time produce in the course of analysis. I preferred to publish the list sooner rather than later in order to solicit feedback. As time passed I sometimes questioned this decision, but not enough to change course.

Older sources present a set of challenges the least of which are inconsistent spelling and other vagaries of description. They also frequently interchange congregational names with addresses and conflate, confuse, or duplicate congregational names. Denominational directories of the 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> centuries often lag behind the reality on the ground. City directories and newspaper listings, however, are generally more timely, accurate, and consistent. In the interest of fullness I included every name which I believe to refer to a congregation of the Stone-Campbell Movement. Sometimes the sources were simply wrong. For example, in a very few cases they mistake a congregation of the Church of God for a Stone-Campbell one. Occasionally Emmanuel Church of Christ (in East Nashville) is listed among Churches of Christ. One of my guiding assumptions is this list should with accuracy and precision document the nomenclature rather than pass judgment upon it. Therefore I sifted the out the erroneous entries and allowed the remaining variants to stand as I encountered them.

In terms of the form of the entries, I list each variant in alphabetical order and cross-reference as extensively as the sources require. I decided early on not to repeat the phrase 'Church of Christ' since most entries refer to acapella congregations which nearly universally used it as part of their name. Simply put, its repetition on nearly every line was too much, visually speaking. In early editions of this list I stated a procedural choice rooted in an assumption. The procedural choice I followed was that unless otherwise noted, 'Church of Christ' was implied; the assumption was that those entries refer to acapella congregations (e.g., 'River Road' should be assumed as short hand for 'River Road Church of Christ'). While the procedural choice remains intact, that assumption does not now hold true across the board as several congregations which retain 'Church of Christ' as part of their name now use instruments in worship. In some ways this is not unlike the reality of the nineteenth century when some congregations using 'Church of Christ' pas part of their name used instruments; and some congregations using 'Christian Church' were always acapella in their worship practice. Historically the nomenclature was fluid, and that fluidity is returning. In keeping with my original intent to compile a clean, efficient list to identify entities and clarify relationships, I do not intend to track in this list the character of congregations beyond the very broad distinctions between Churches of Christ and Disciples of Christ/Christian Churches, or to distinguish between two congregations sharing the same name but differing in geography (such as the congregations on Old Hickory Boulevard) or racial composition of the majority membership (such as the two Green Street congregations). I intend to track the way congregations identified themselves, and were known by the public. To that end unless otherwise noted readers should assume 'Church of Christ' is part of the name of each entity listed.

Congregations now affiliated with the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) are indicated with the parenthetical designation '(Disciples of Christ).' Christian Churches not formally affiliated with Disciples of Christ or congregations using the name "Christian Church" prior to the 1968 Restructure are not indicated as 'Disciples of Christ of Christ' (e.g., Aspen Grove Christian Church). In the case of Christian Churches which affiliated with the Christian Church (Disciples of

Christ of Christ), I list them twice since in every case a formal change of the congregation's name took place so as to fully identify the congregation with their parent denomination (e.g. Vine Street Christian Church and Vine Street Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).

Where congregations sponsored a separate worship service or mission point as an ongoing ministry program (e.g. Chapel Avenue and the Home for the Aged Church), I followed the sources' lead and counted each as a separate congregation. I do the same with multi-site congregations (e.g. Ethos Church) and identify each campus as a discrete congregation.

In the cases where a congregation changed names several times, at any one entry I list only the immediate preceding or subsequent variation. Follow the leads to discover additional cross-references. At points where the only variant is a minor spelling variance (e.g. Epp Avenue and Epps Avenue), this list seems needlessly detailed. However, that Nashville can have three distinct congregations in close proximity, to wit Charlotte Avenue, Charlotte Pike (black) and Charlotte Pike (white), and cases such as these that confuse even the locals, I trust a detailed name authority proves its worth.

The county boundaries shifted over time, especially with the formation of Cheatham County from western portions of Davidson County. The Nashville city limits steadily expanded until the formation of metropolitan government wherein they became coterminous with the county line. I include in this list all congregations which were within either city or county limits, however those entities were defined at the time of the congregations' existence (see Sam's Creek, now in Cheatham County, formerly in Davidson). In three cases Nashville congregations migrated out of the county to southern suburbs but I retained them in this list (see Concord Road, Otter Creek, and Aspen Grove).

Finally, I'm confident I overlooked or mis-stated something. This is the latest iteration of a long-standing project. I welcome clarification and correction. Clint Holloway, Jan Crowder, Chris Cotten, and Jeremy Sweets clarified relationships among and between congregations, often supplied information and research leads, and repeatedly scouted the historical materials without which this study simply would not be what it is. Of the many who expressed interest in this project, they have been especially supportive and encouraging.

**Also** – Refers to alternate names used in contemporary sources. In some cases, this refers only to minor spelling variations in older sources. See Mead's Chapel.

**Earlier** – Refers to the immediately prior name by which a congregation was known. Usually a formal name change accompanied a physical relocation. See Paragon Mills.

**Later** – Refers to the immediately subsequent name by which a congregation was known. Usually a formal name change accompanied a physical relocation. See Seifried Street.

**From** – Refers to a split or division. All parties are listed and cross-referenced. See Ewing Lane. **Merged with** or **Merged into** or **Absorbed** – All parties to the merger are listed and cross-referenced. See Northside.

**Multi-site** – Refers to a permanent separate assembly (not a mission point intended to become a discrete congregation) operated by a congregation on parity basis with its other locations. See Ethos Church.

**Operates** – Refers to a permanent separate assembly (not a mission point intended to become a discrete congregation) operated by a congregation as a service. See Chapel Avenue.

? – Indicates a hypothesis based on available information. See Buena Vista Mission.
