How to Convert 3000 People

Acts 2:41

INTRO: Many of us wonder why we are not converting more people. We are constantly trying to find our cause of failure. What is the matter? What area we doing wrong?

I. WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO CONVERT A PERSON?

- A. Being Good to People. Some say, "I have been good to my neighbors. I help them when they are sick; I have taken them in my car. I have them to over to dinner. I have been good to them, but I just can't get them to attend services." Being good to people is a great help, but it will not convert them.
- B. Begging and Pleading. Some say: I have been begging and pleading with my friends to come to services. I told them how friendly we are; I told them they would like our preacher and our teachers. I have been begging and pleading, but I just cannot get them interested.
- C. How Much the Church Needs Them. I have told them how much the church needs their help, but they just don't seem to care.

II. IT MUST TAKE JUST THE RIGHT PERSON.

It is true that some people can reach and influence other people better than some. But this cannot be the answer.

III. IT TAKES THE RIGHT THING.

- A. What Thing Did Peter Make Plain? Peter made plain they were lost. Acts 2:36-37; Acts 3:13-15, 17-19.
- B. A Person Must Know His Condition Before He Moves. Before he will be saved, he must know he is lost.
- C. We May Be Cast into Prison for It. Acts 4:3.
- D. We May Be Taken to Court for It. Acts 4:5-7.
- E. We May Be Stoned for It. Acts 7:52-60.
- F. But When We Convince Men That They Are Lost, They Will Move. Note Acts 2:37-41.
