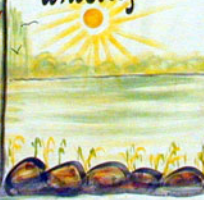

PARABLE OF THE SOWER

Luke 8:4-8

INTRO: This is one of the most interesting of the parables. The disciples did not understand; Jesus had to explain. Luke 8:9-15.

I. THE SOWER. LUKE 8:5.

- A. The Teacher. Matt. 28:19-20; 1 Cor. 3:6; Mark 4:14; Psa. 126:5-6; Ecc. 11:6.
- B. The Seed. Luke 8:5; Gal. 6:7.
- C. The Word. Luke 6:11; Rom. 1:16; James 1:21. The seed falls on four types of soils (hearts).
- D. The Wayside. Luke 8:5. Paths across fields or where foot prints are, not prepared soil.
- E. The Unconverted. Luke 8:12; Rom. 10:17. Seed does not take root, devil takes away.

II. THE ROCKY GROUND. LUKE 8:6.

- A. No Root. Luke 8:6.
- B. No Moisture. Sun scorched; house tops green. Mark 4:6.
- C. Saved Believers. Luke 8:13.
- D. Surface Religion. Luke 8:6.
- E. Persecution. This caused some to fall away. Mark 4:16-17
- F. Fell Away—In unbelief. Luke 8:13.

III. THE THORNY GROUND. LUKE 8:7; MARK 4:7.

- A. Choked. Mark 4:7.
- B. No Fruit. Mark 4:7
- C. Worldliness. Luke 8:14.
- D. Cares.

- A. Prepared Soil. Seed retained; no rocks; no roads,
- B. The Faithful. Luke 8:15;
- C. Honest. Matt. 13:15, 23.
- D. Word Kept. Matt. 13:23; Luke 8:15; 2 Pet. 1:5-11.
- E. Christian Growth. 30 – 60 – 100. Matt. 25:14-30. 5-2-1 Talents.
